Thanks to all who assisted last Sunday. We had a 47 and included a Baptism as part of the Service. This Sunday will be another Baptism as part of our Service. It is so nice to be celebrating these events.

As has been announced, effective Sept. 22nd, vaccination certificates will be required for 57 of our parishioners who are leaders or members of specific committees. Those affected have been advised to provide that information to the office by Sept. 22nd. Last January, the Federal Government sent seniors a \$300 assistance cheque/deposit. We asked if you felt you did not need it, to please donate to St. Mark's operating fund. Many did and it certainly helped our finances. A further \$500 was to be sent in July! The button was pushed and we received the \$500 on or about the 3nd week of August. So once again we are asking for your assistance for the operating account with some or all of the \$500. The amount will have a donation receipt for this year and donors will also receive a CHERRY PIE when they are baked.
