I misinterpreted the new Diocesan policy about vaccination requirements for ministry leaders and volunteers. All we need is to see proof of vaccination and then record names and the date of the second vaccination. We DON'T need to keep a copy of the vaccine certificates themselves. This clearly makes sense now that I think about it. I know some people have been disquieted with having to give this information, and I'm sorry my directions to Roxanne and the Wardens were incorrect.

So, she has destroyed all of that information and has only retained names and the date of the second vaccination - as per the guidelines. So if you are someone who needs to show proof of vaccination in order to continue doing your particular ministry and have been hesitating because you didn't want us to retain copies of this information, I hope this helps.

We are obviously living in a new world, what with proof of vaccination needed in restaurants and so forth, and there are lots of growing pains. But we need to be thankful for leadership, both civilly and ecclesiastically, who have implemented these requirements. Yes, they may be tedious, but if they help those who are hesitant to get vaccinated, that's wonderful. We're all in this together and the only way to get out of it is together. The biggest tragedy is how this pandemic, which brought us all together when it began (remember the nightly banging of pots for healthcare workers?) is now driving us apart. We must be careful that we don't become causes for division ourselves.

I know this is all very tiring and confusing. We want this to be over. But wishing that it were over, or acting as if it's no big deal, won't help. So let's continue to be a community of faith that truly models what love of neighbour means. Now is not the time to lose heart.

These requirements do not apply to worship services; however, we understand they do apply to any indoor meeting (parish council or Bible studies included) or event not associated with worship. And while our ministry guidelines do not currently permit rentals to parishioners or community groups, tenants and license agreement holders using our spaces will also need to comply.
