A large thank you to The Venerable Lynne Marchand for being our "interim" and guest preacher, while Fr. Leighton has been on vacation. Lynne and her husband Rick have become a welcomed member of St. Mark's and we hope to see them on a regular basis. This past week we have lost a parishioner, Ross Tomlinson. Please keep Tina and family in your prayers.

We continue with our one service at 10:30 on Sunday with live streaming. We are continuing to have some sound issues on the uploads to Facebook and YouTube and are working to minimize this issue.

We continue to be restricted in our numbers and to follow exactly the protocols issued by the Diocese. We received on Thursday the latest update which continues to keep the same restrictions that have been previously issued. Although Covid-19 numbers are lower in some areas, there is a major concern about the uptick there has been in the past few weeks mainly with unvaccinated people or those with a single shot. We continue to encourage everyone to be vaccinated not only to protect themselves but those whose space they may be in.

Fr. Leighton will be back for Sunday Service on August 29th and we will start Bible Study after the September long week-end as well as Wednesday Morning service. We are now in that period of financial concerns. Without the usual July Cherry Festival and other events that greatly impacted our bank account and without any current expectations for the Fall, we need to rely on our parishioners to maintain their givings or consider an extra donation. Many responded to our extra month "ask" last year. This Sunday is a special date for our long-time parishioner Donald Combe, who will be celebrating his 90<sup>th</sup> Birthday. For more than 30 years Donald has been a historian, archivist, sexton, raconteur. He co-authored (with Fred Habermehl) more than 20 publications on the history of St. Mark's and its members. Donald spearheaded (with Percy Webb) the planting of indigenous trees in the cemetery, more than 80 were planted since 1990, and the current stones preservation project (16 stones are under restoration) including the butcher's block, Chrysler and Waters (obelisk). Donald is also working on a project to update the cemetery maps and transcriptions for the Ontario Genealogical Society.
