FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

We live in an age in which the spiritual has become fashionable and ubiquitous; spiritualities are legion. Yet most of those interested in spirituality, in those things concerning the spirit, don't think that the Church is a place they might go to find and to nurture it. Christians aren't seen to be spiritual people, nor are we seen to be people whose hearts and minds have been so transformed that our lives reflect something of God's abundant love and joy. Most often, we're seen as merely dull, or as conformists who don't practice what we preach, or even as escapists who shut ourselves away from reality. And the truth is, that's by-and-large a fair assessment of what passes for Christianity these days. We have lost both our sense of adventure and our enthusiasm and have become, in the process, restrained and uninspired.

All too often, the Church is a place of transaction, but it should be a place of transformation. On Sunday we'll observe the Baptism of the Lord. We used to think of baptism as the ultimate transaction: get baptized into Christ's body and you'll be given eternal life. But it isn't a transaction; it's an act of transformation. The waters open us up to the radical—and radically renewing—love God which has power to transform lives with the understanding that to be a member of Christ's body follower is to yearn to set the world on fire and to be given tongues to speak of things we do not yet understand.

But talk is cheap and simply talking to people about our faith makes very little difference. What does make a difference and change lives is an experience of the transformative liberation of the Spirit through things such as gestures of kindness, expressions of sympathy and acts of forgiveness. You see, it isn't belief that is most important, nor is it even understanding that is paramount. The thing that is most important is action. We can believe

all the things we like about God; we can say the right words and observe the correct rites, but if we don't do anything that will help to make all of the things we believe and say and do come true, it won't, in the long run, matter one iota.

But if we can find a way to dare to seek to make our communities of faith places of genuine transformation, if we can find a way to strive to make our lives occasions for transformation, if we can find a way to dare to endeavour to fan the flames of transformational fire, we may begin to feel the Spirit rushing like a mighty wind: a wind mighty enough to, once-and-for-all, truly take our hearts and set them on fire.
